I hope you have been keeping well. I am writing to let you know, especially those of you in the Atlanta/North Georgia area, that the Ulster-Scots Society of America, despite the recession and tight pocket books, will once again hold our Annual General Membership Meeting in conjunction with the 37th Annual Stone Mountain Highland Games at Stone Mountain Park and at the Hilton Atlanta Northeast near Atlanta, Georgia across the weekend of October 16-18, 2009 with special emphasis being given to the evening of Saturday, October 17.

The U-SSA has once again been invited to be a Sponsoring Society at the Stone Mountain Highland Games. This prestigious festival is now rated as the premier Scottish cultural event in the United States with thousands in attendance and showcases the leading Scots heritage organizations in the country. With only limited Clan and Society participation offered, this is a unique environment to unveil the Society to a wider audience. The U-SSA will have a Society tent both Saturday and Sunday the 17th and 18th with books and other educational materials to help tell the story of the Ulster-Scots and their impact on America. Your help is appreciated as volunteers will be needed.

As a special treat, during our evening gathering on Saturday, October 17 at 6:45 p.m. in the Cobb & DeKalb Rooms at the Hilton Atlanta Northeast Hotel 5993 Peachtree Industrial Blvd. Norcross, GA, (770) 447-4747, we will sponsor a program, "UNCOVERING YOUR SCOTS-IRISH HERITAGE: History, Genealogy, Travel", conducted by Fintan Mullan, Executive Director of the Ulster Historical Foundation based in Belfast, Northern Ireland. Many of you may know of the excellent books and research tools available through the UHF aiding the historian and individual genealogist alike. The program will offer an overview of aspects of the settlement of Ulster and Ulster immigration to North America particularly in the 18th century, identify genealogical sources and tools to help you make additional discoveries about your Scots-Irish/Ulster-Scots heritage, and give an update on the July, 2010 Ulster-Scots Heritage Tour to Northern Ireland where you can explore the land, culture, and cousins of your ancestors during the 400th anniversary of the Plantation of Ulster 1610-2010. The tour may be the subject of a BBC documentary. Come and learn how you might appear in it!

Our time together Saturday will give you a chance to make an acquaintance with one of the leading researchers of the Ulster-Scots/Scots-Irish story and genealogy. The program will be followed by book purchasing opportunities and a reception with food and drinks. Attendees can receive a free brochure "The Scots in Ulster" and enter a drawing for a "Plantation of Ulster" CD Rom and a copy of "Scotch-Irish Colonial Merchants". The program and reception will be open and free to both Society members and the public to garner increased awareness in the Ulster-Scots Society and Ulster-Scots story and to fulfill our Society's mission of educating the public. With us will also be Alan Bowen, President of the Overmountain Victory Trail Association in 1780's period attire relaying the story of the largely Ulster-Scots overmountain men who won the critical Battle of King's Mountain during the Revolutionary War.

We may also be joined by eminent Scotch-Irish scholar Dr. Richard MacMaster who is launching his new book, "Scotch-Irish Colonial Merchants" which will be available at the program along with other fine UHF titles. We will be joined over the weekend by Dr. Ian Adamson and Jacqui Reed, Board Members of the Ulster-Scots Agency from Belfast, Northern Ireland, who will give us insight into the latest related to the Ulster-Scots cultural scene in Ulster and abroad. They will be accompanied by the Northern Ireland musical trio "Stonewall" which will be performing at the Games.
